USEFUL CITIZEN GONE.

In the death of E. E. Charman, Oregon City and Clackamas county lose a most respected citizen.

More enterprising and public spirited citizens than was Mr. Charman are rare. For years he served in the City Council, taking a live interest in all questions pertaining to the interests of the city.

SCHOLARSHIP AND ITS REWARD.

In his Harvard address, which touched upon several burning topics, President Roosevelt briefly referred to the striking contrast between the rewards of success in industry and those commanded by men and women who devote themselves to science, art, education or scholarship generally.

Meantime it is certainly important to render the life of the scholar, educator, investigator, conscientious artist a little more attractive in a material sense than it now is, else the "strong and virile" will turn more to law, commerce and politics.

Since the creation of the Carnegie fund for agencies a good deal has been written on the existing college pension schemes and present rates of professorial pay.

The whole matter deserves more systematic consideration than it has received, and the President's timely plea will tend to direct proper attention thereto.

THE TERMS OF THE ANGLO-JAPANESE TREATY.

The text of the new treaty of alliance between England and Japan, just published, confirms the semi-official summaries previously printed and calls for no revision of the judgments already expressed regarding its significance and intended effects.

As the preamble states, the aim of the agreement is to preserve the status quo in the far east and along the frontier of British India.

The treaty provides that if either of the contracting powers shall be involved in war in defense of the rights and interests covered therein the other shall at once actively come to its assistance.

assistance. This is the provision which Lord Lansdowne had in mind when he told parliament that, whereas the old treaty was designed and potent enough to prevent the spread of any conflagration occurring in the far East, the more comprehensive substitute would surely prevent any conflagration in that region during the period of its duration—ten years.

There is no ground for the contention of certain French publicists that the treaty spells partnership in China at the expense of the outsiders.

THE REPUBLICAN LINE IS SOLID.

Senator Foraker denies the Democratic reports that he is at variance with the administration on the railway rate regulation question or anything else.

It is apparent from the senator's words in his speech in Ohio, as well as from his expressions in newspaper interviews since then, that he is not immovable in his opposition to the principle of rate regulation.

A rate-regulation bill is to be introduced in the Senate at the opening of the session. Previous to that time according to present plans, there will be a meeting, not only of the interstate commerce committee, but of all Republican leaders of the Senate, to secure harmony on the rate-regulation issue.

The President, it is said, has expressed the opinion that there will be no tariff legislation in the coming session. In this view he is in accord with the bulk of the Republican leaders.
