An ordinance assessing the probable cost of the improvement of Alley in Block 22 of Oregon City, Oregon, from the East line of Main Street Easterly a distance of 160 feet, and directing an entry of such assessment in the Docket of City Liens. Whereas the Council of Oregon City does Ordain as follows: Section 1. 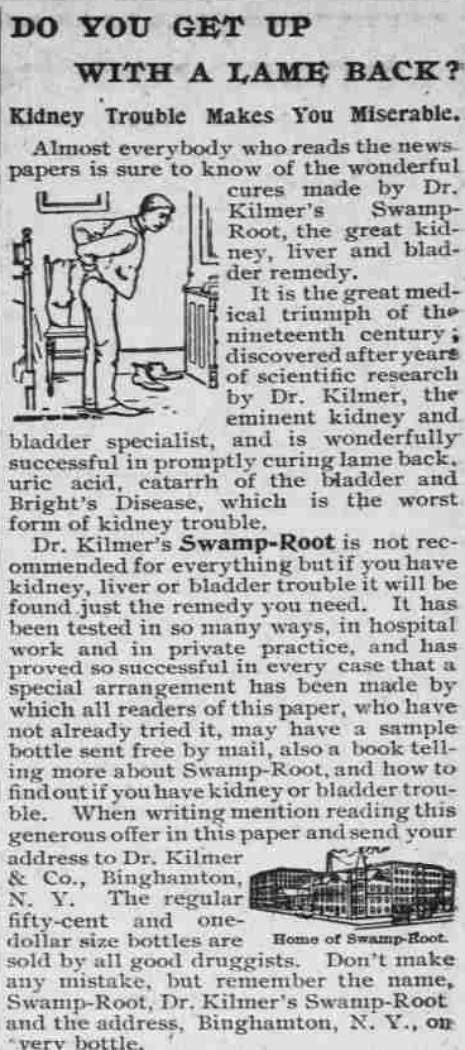
