JUDGE RYAN FILES PETITION.

Gives Platform on Which He Asks State Treasurership.

County Judge T. F. Ryan, of this city, candidate for the Republican nomination for State Treasurer, last Saturday filed in the office of Secretary of State Dunbar his petition for nomination and declaration of principles.

Judge Ryan's platform, as outlined in his petition, is as follows: "If I am nominated and elected I will during my term of office, perform every duty required of the State Treasurer in a strict conformity to the law and as economically as efficient as and satisfactory service will permit.

Regarding the State Treasurer as but the trustee and custodian of the public property placed in his charge, I favor the enactment of laws providing how such property shall be used, kept or invested, and that all profit or interest accruing to same shall be the property of the State and accounted for as such, and especially 'Favor law prohibiting using public money for private gain or corporation profit."
