Regarding the State Treasurer as but the trustee and custodian of the public property placed in his charge, I favor the enactment of laws providing how such property shall be used, kept or invested, and that all profit or interest accruing to same shall be the property of the State and accounted for as such, and especially 'Favor law prohibiting using public money for private gain or corporation profit.
