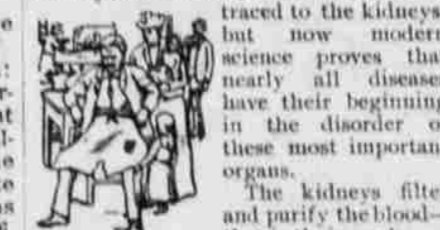

WILL HELP ONLY THEMSELVES.

Socialists Are Not to Register Under Any Other Party Name.

For Clackamas County Socialists to register as a Republicans or as members of any other political organization in order to participate at primary election in April will be considered sufficient grounds to disqualify them from a further participation in the councils of their party according to an edict that has been issued by Claud S. Howard, secretary of the Socialist party in this county. In his letter Mr. Howard says:

"The Direct Primary election is only for those parties which have polled 25 per cent of the vote of the last election. Consequently only the Republican and Democratic parties will nominate their candidates in this election and it is not honorable for the Socialists to register as a Republican or a Democrat and take part in nominating their candidates. Any Socialist who does so will be debared from taking part in the county convention that will be held by the Socialists early in April. If you are registered already the law provides that you may change your declaration before the registration books close for the Primary election."

A great many Democrats and a few Socialists in this county have already registered as Republicans in order to be permitted to participate in the Republican Primary election. By reason of this the majority of Republican voters in the county is made to appear considerably augmented. The registration to date amounts to about 1800 voters, of whom 1500 have registered as Republicans. The normal Republican majority in the county ranges from about 500 on the county ticket to 1200 on the legislative ticket.

THE YELLOW FEVER GERM.
