ALFALFA AIDS DAIRYING.

Growing of This Foodstuff is Strongly Recommended.

In a letter to the Enterprise, Paul Shoup, assistant general freight agent for the Harriman lines in Oregon, writes as follows:

"After a thorough investigation our company believes that the dairy industry of the Willamette Valley can be made more profitable, and the production greatly increased, through the growing of alfalfa.

"While many attempts have been made in the valley to grow alfalfa, and in some places with commercial success, yet the valley can hardly be classed as a producer of alfalfa as a crop. Therefore the Southern Pacific Company proposes, in different parts of the Willamette Valley, to plant 20 or more tracts in alfalfa and to endeavor to cultivate it successfully.

"The object to be attained is, first, to determine under what conditions and in what sections of the valley alfalfa can be grown successfully; and second, to give as wide publicity as possible to the results obtained, that farmers interested may have the value of our experience where desired.

"Mr. W. W. Cotton, who has had much practical experience in alfalfa culture, is preparing a pamphlet on this subject.

"We would be very glad to have your co-operation in giving this subject such publicity as you see fit, together with the statement that if any of your readers are interested, Mr. Cotton's pamphlet will be mailed to anyone who sends his address to me--Worcester Building, Portland, Ore.

Subsequently, as our experiments progress, bulletins will be issued from time to time, giving information as to such progress, and these also will be sent to addresses furnished.

"The market for dairy products is practically unlimited so far as Oregon is concerned, since condensed milk, butter and cheese can now be easily transported for long distances. I will call your attention to one home market, as an example, open to Oregon, and that is Alaska. The movement of butter and cheese during the twelve months ending June 30th last from Puget Sound to Alaska, amounted to 1,339,000 pounds.

COUNTY APPROPRIATES \$30,000.

Clackamas is Practical on Theory of Good Roads.

The Clackamas County Court has made its annual apportionment of the road fund to the various road districts of the county. The total amount apportioned was \$30,000. During the year 1905, Clackamas county will expend an immense amount of money in the improvement of roads and the repair and construction of bridges throughout the County.

Unless emergencies arise, no further appropriations will be made until next year. Under the charter of Estacada, the town is entitled to all of the road tax collected within its boundaries. Milwaukie secures 50 per cent of its tax, and Oregon City and Canby 60 per cent of the amounts collected. The apportionment by districts, together with the valuations, follows:
