
# **EX-STATE SENATOR HARVEY E. CROSS**



A Candidate for Joint Representative for Clackamas and Multnomah Counties.

Mr. H. E. Cross, in announcing his candidacy for the position of Joint Representative, for Multnomah and Clackamas counties, has subscribed in his petition for the nomination to a very brief platform, as follows:

phone, street railways, railroads, etc. "Third-For the enactment of a state banking law that has for its end the protection of depositors and the creation of the office of State Bank Exam-

"Fourth-For depositing all state funds with due regard for safety and security, so as to bring the largest revenue to the state, and providing that all income therefrom shall revert to the state, and making it a felony for the State Treasurer personally to receive any compensation in the shape of interest or otherwise from such deposits.

"Fifth-For enacting a law to reduce the number of State Normal Schools to two or less.

"Sixth-For placing the State Printer on a flat salary.

"Seventh-For the employment of convicts in the betterment of the

public roads, instead of in competition with free labor.

"We desire to state that we want it distinctly understood that the second article of our platform shall be construed to mean that we consider ourselves bound to vote for a law or laws revoking all perpetual franchises, and all other franchises not paying a revenue, and empowering municipalities to place all franchises on an equal basis.


