HIGH SCHOOL WILL PUBLISH A PAPER

OREGON CITY STUDENTS WILL ISSUE A MONTHLY—WILL JACKSON EDITOR.

High school students of Oregon City are going to evince a spirit of enterprise by publishing a high school paper in the near future. The paper will probably be a monthly edition, and the first number will be issued in about ten days. Material is now being gathered for the first issue. No regular board of editors has been selected up to the present time, but the brunt of the work is being shouldered by William Jackson, Allie Grout and Oudin Robertson. Mr. Jackson is the editor, Mr. Grout the business manager and Mr. Robertson files the office of advertising manager.

The purpose of the new publication will be two-fold. In the first place it will be a means of interesting the pupils more thoroughly in literary work of a practical nature. In the second place the paper will be the medium of conveying to the public the idea of what the high school is doing and what might be done if needed improvements and innovations were made, for as it is the local high school is handicapped by virtue of the fact that only the first two years of high school are offered. This causes many pupils to attend the Portland schools where a full four year course is being given. The enrollment and the equipment at the present time is adequate enough, considering that only two high school grades attend, but competition with other high schools is almost impossible since other schools have such a large field to draw from in comparison. With the addition of two more years of high school work this inequality would be eliminated, and relations, both in an athletic and scholastic way, could be taken up with other institutions.

Another project is now under way to organize literary and debating societies, two in number, one for the boys and one for the girls. They will meet every Friday afternoon. This is not an absolutely new idea, but the old societies died out a few years ago and nothing has been done along that line of work since that time. The enrollment at the present time is 54. The first month of school, which closes Friday, shows an enrollment slightly in excess of that reported last year.
