RECEIPTS INCREASE IN COUNTY OFFICES

DELINQUENT TAX LIST WILL TOTAL \$800 LESS THAN LAST YEAR.

Financial reports from various county officials for November compare more than favorably with last month's and also with last year's reports at the same time.

The sheriff's office shows a most gratifying condition in connection with the delinquent tax list. November 1 the list totaled \$3,888.02, as compared with \$4,139.01 for December 1 of last year. It was predicted a month ago that the amount would probably be reduced to \$3,500 before the time for publication arrived. At present the list has already dwindled to approximately \$3,300, more than \$800 less than last year.

The county clerk's office for November shows receipts in fees of \$655, as compared with \$775 for last November. The decrease in circuitous emphy by the fact that Judge McBride held court in October which diverted a considerable amount into the October funds that would naturally have gone into November. Taking the two months and comparing with last year the report shows \$1221.75 for this year October and November, and \$1154.50 for last year.

A steady advance is noticeable in the county clerk's office for the last five or six years. For November the figures are as follows: 1902, \$282.00; 1903, \$565.00; 1904, \$542.00; 1905, \$775.40; 1906, \$665.00.

The recorder's report gives the receipts for November of 1905 and 1906 to be \$248.65 and \$326.95 respectively.

WILL BRING SUIT FOR SPECIAL TAX

Oak Grove Road Supervisor Will Start Action Against Six Milwaukeeans.

Road Supervisor Henry Thiessen of road district No. 34, Oak Grove, is going to bring action in the justice court at Milwaukee against six taxpayers in his district for refusing to pay the special tax levied for road improvements. It is not known yet whether any more actions will be necessary or not.
