Will the county be held responsible for the death of Mrs. Wilhelm Ott, of near Clackamas Station on Saturday morning. This question has been heard on all sides and many think that the men at work blasting near the Ott home were exceedingly careless. Mrs. Ott had been watching the men at work for sometime and in noticing a blast was about ready she was afraid to remain in the house while a huge stump was being blasted. Stepping out from the rear door of her residence just as the charge went off, Mrs. Ott was struck in the back by a section of the stump weighing about 50 pounds, and was almost instantly killed. The force of the explosion carried the missile 150 yards and over the roof of the dwelling. Mrs. Ott was mortally wounded and died before a physician could reach the scene of the accident from this city. She was aged 46 years and is survived by a husband and one sister, Mrs. Albert Notz of Clackamas Station.

The coroner was notified but did not consider that the circumstances surrounding the accident required an official investigation. However, he warned the men who were clearing the road of obstructions to discontinue using such heavy charges of the explosive in conducting their work. Thirteen sticks of powder, each weighing 2 1/2 of a pound, were employed for blasting the stump that was directly responsible for the death of Mrs. Ott. FALLS OFF OVERLAND RUNNING FULL SPEED

"BLACK JACK," CARE-FREE TOURIST, "DROPS OFF" WHILE ROUNDING CURVE.

William Cummings, who was attempting to get the better of the Southern Pacific by stealing a ride on the evening train going south Saturday, reached Oregon City with the startling news that his partner, "Black Jack" had fallen off the train between Milwaukie and Clackamas Station and had perhaps lost his life. The two men were riding on the outside between the vestibules of the two passenger coaches and on reaching a sharp curve "Black Jack" was thrown off by the plunging side motion of the cars. Sheriff Beatie was notified and in company with Cummings and J. N. Hamilton of the Fashion Stables drove to Parkplace late Saturday evening. The track was followed for all possible clues of the missing man when finally his hat was picked up this side of Milwaukie. As the search did not reveal as much as the officials desired, the homeward route was taken, reaching this city early Sunday morning. When daylight broke Sheriff Beatie again started driving as far as Milwaukie where upon investigation, from A. O. Olds, who lives between Milwaukie and Clackamas Station he learned that a man with a broken arm, broken nose and a badly bruised head had called at his home late the previous night for assistance and a place to rest. Mr. Olds expressed his desire to take the man to Oregon City for medical assistance, but the other wanted to be driven to Portland. On account of the lateness of the hour and the great distance the drive was not attempted. "Black Jack" was given shelter in the barn and was well enough Sunday morning to leave for Portland. Sheriff Beatie upon learning of the man's departure for the "Rose City" did not pursue him as he thought the officials of Multnomah could just as well take care of him.
