DENVER SUITS WIFE; HUSBAND COMPLAINS

TWO MEN AND ONE WOMAN. SEEKING DIVORCE FROM MIS-MATES.

George Anderson has filed complaint in the circuit court to secure a divorce from Mary H. Anderson. Plaintiff's cause of action is based on the complaint that the parties were husband and wife, having intermarried at Denver, Col., on April 3, 1905; that the plaintiff is now and has been a resident of the state of Oregon, but on or about the 27th day of September, 1904, the plaintiff, George Anderson, under an agreement, left Denver and came to Portland with the understanding that the wife was to follow. Though requested by the husband on a number of occasions to follow the plaintiff and come to live with him, the defendant refused and still does continue to desert and live separate and apart. The plaintiff prays that the bond of matrimony be dissolved.

H. R. Koen began suit for divorce in the circuit court Friday morning from Anna E. Koen. The plaintiff is now living in the state of Oregon. The two were married at Newcastle, Pa., on the 19th of August, 1903, but after the first year the defendant left the plaintiff and has refused to return.

Plaintiff seeks for a decree annulling and setting aside bonds of matrimony.

Mattie A. Weesner begs the court for divorce decree from A. Elbert Weesner. They were married at Minnville in 1893 and have lived together since but during this time he has failed, neglected and refused to support plaintiff and the plaintiff claims she has supported herself and child and to a large extent supported defendant by hiring out as a servant. Plaintiff seeks decree annulling bonds of matrimony and prays that she shall have right to visit at her pleasure the son, Lloyd Garrison Weesner.

PRIMITIVE METHODS FOR LOADING S. P. CARS

EXPEDIENTS FORCED ON SHIPPERS AT OREGON CITY BY BIG CORPORATION.

Lindsey Bros. are loading a large number of cars with lumber, just south of the Southern Pacific depot. Considerable time is being taken as the method used in loading is rather a primitive one. This is due to the inaccessible approach to the tracks from the alleys between Main street and the Southern Pacific track.

A temporary slide of a few planks has been placed on the embankment and with the aid of a horse "ging away" up and down the track a few pieces of timber are drawn on the cars.

A switch and loading place for S. P. is badly needed here, and methods now being used to load cars are surely detrimental to shipping of Oregon City and vicinity.

The Southern Pacific has often been courteously asked by the manufacturers and merchants of this city and the mill owners and other shippers the surrounding country to do something in the way of improving antiquated methods now in use.

No doubt to many citizens of other cities, who pass on the trains daily the work now going on amuses them and they wonder whether the shipments of Oregon City and vicinity warrant no better equipment.

HOP BUYING ACTIVE; RULING PRICE 14¢

Shorts Advance of \$1.50 a Ton—Retail at 85 Cents per Sack.

Hop buying was more active during the last week than at any time since the picking season. The ruling price was 14 cents.

Shorts have lately taken a jump of \$1.50 a ton. The local market on shorts is now 85 cents per sack. Barley is \$1.15 per sack.

GRANGERS REPORT AGAINST JUTE MILL

Gresham, Dec. 15.—The special Grange committee, to which was referred the question whether the state should establish a jute mill at the Salem penitentiary, has made its report and recommends that the master of the Oregon State Grange be requested to appoint a committee of three to study the matter carefully and to confer with the Legislative committee.

The committee's report is lengthy and in the main unfavorable to the jute mill project.
