STATE WARRANTS FOR U. S. ROAD TAX

Secretary of State Sends Out Area Graded Apportionment to Counties. Secretary of State Dunbar issued Thursday at Salem the warrants for the distribution of the United States five per cent road fund, which is apportioned among the counties according to area. Clackamas county with 1,107,200 acres of land receives \$408.49. Harney, with 6,780,160 acres, received the largest sum, \$2,501.45; Malheur following closely with 6,277,440 acres and receiving \$2,315.98. Multnomah has the smallest acreage, 281,920, and gets the smallest amount, \$104.01.

STATE WARRANTS FOR U. S. ROAD TAX

President Roosevelt is voted the Nobel peace prize by the Norwegian Storting (parliament) in recognition of his services in ending the Russo-Japanese war. The prize carries with it 128,536 crowns or \$27,127.65 in money and this sum Mr. Roosevelt will convey to trustees to be used by them as the foundation of a fund the income of which is to be used in bringing together a conference at Washington of representatives of capital and labor for the purpose of discussing industrial problems and promotion of industrial peace.
