

ELECTRIC PLANTS ON CLACKAMAS

JOHN W. MELDRUM TO APPROPRIATE WATERS OF CLACKAMAS RIVER.

John W. Meldrum has placed in the county recorder's office a notice of appropriation of water of the Clackamas river. He intends to appropriate 10,000,000 cubic inches of the water of said stream by miners' measurement, under a six inch pressure, being in volume a continuous flow of 5000 cubic feet of water per second. The place the water is to be diverted is on the right bank of the Clackamas river in the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of sec. 11, 4 s r-4 E.

The water to be diverted will be conveyed by means of pipe lines and the water is to be used for the purpose of developing the mineral resources of the State of Oregon, and to furnish electrical power and energy of light, power and all other purposes. There is to be one dam constructed 120 feet high across the Clackamas where the water is to be diverted.

NEW SAWMILL TO BE STARTED

MR. HODSON BIDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SAW MILL THIS SIDE OF NEW ERA.

Mr. Hodson of Oregon City has been receiving sealed bids for the contract of constructing a new saw mill, five miles south of this city.

The location of the mill, just this side of New Era, is a good one, having easy access to the transportation lines, being located just between the river and the tracks of the Southern Pacific company. The mill will be 32x130 and a large force of men are to be kept busy. Both rough and dressed lumber will be cut and prepared for shipment.
