VETERAN COLLEGE HEAD TO RETIRE

Dr. Thomas M. Gatch, president of the Oregon Agricultural College, has been elected to receive, at his option, the privileges of the Carnegie Foundation for the Aid of Teachers.

President Gatch gave his intention of retiring next June from the presidency of the college and the regents have secured this gift of appreciation.

From the information at hand it appears that Dr. Gatch can, by retiring, take advantage of the allowance beginning January 1, or he may select any future time in which to do so.

Dr. Gatch's proposed retirement from the presidency of the college is of his own election. Though he is still hale and hearty, and one of the hardest workers in the faculty of the institution, he wishes to be rid of the intricate and onerous duties that characterize the complex institution of which he has been the head for the past ten years.

DAMAGE SUIT OF BOSWELL VS REED

In the damage suit of Boswell vs. Reed, both of Estacada, the latter, Mayor J. W. At times she has been forced to secure employment in order to support herself and defendant would then hunt her place of abode and abuse her.

WARNED EMPLOYEE; IN TOILS HIMSELF

Friendly Acts Bring Trouble to George Spees, Formerly of Clackamas.

George E. Spees, a former resident of this county, whose home was near Linn's Mill, has placed himself in a peculiar position by warning an employee who was working for him in Portland, against the police.

Mr. Spees is a member of the plumbing firm of Spees & Smith, 269 Pine street. Hardly had Police Sergeant Jones and Acting Detective Tichenor left the plumbing shop, where they were seeking an employe for whose arrest a warrant had been issued, it is alleged, when George E. Spees sent a messenger to notify the man that the police were after him and he had better make his escape while he had the chance.

As a result the police have failed to lay hands on Arnold Delschneider, for whom they were searching. That the man heeded the warning said to have been conveyed to him by his employer, the police say is shown by his dropping his tools and leaving the house where he was working.

John Ashenbrenner, aged 15 years, who was sent to warn Delschneider, as alleged, was taken to police headquarters shortly after noon, and admitted that Spees had hurried him to the place where his employe was working to let him know that the police were looking for him.

Deputy City Attorney Fitzgerald was notified of the circumstances, and after a brief conference with Police Judge Cameron, announced that a warrant will be issued this afternoon for Spees' arrest on the charge of contempt of court. When the plumber is taken before the Magistrate the charge may be changed to that of being an accessory after the fact to the crime of assault and battery.

Complaint was laid against Delschneider by Sadie Weston, a woman who lived in the same house. She alleges that he picked her up during a quarrel and threw her violently to the floor. Jones and Tichenor went to 269 Pine street to serve the warrant. They were informed by Spees that his employe was plumbing a house at 426 Everett street.

Though Spees may be prosecuted for contempt of court, there is some question as to whether he can be punished for becoming an accessory after the fact to the charge of assault and battery on the woman, because the detectives did not inform him of the nature of the offense for which Delschneider was to be arrested.
