In the matter of report of resurvey of Oregon City and Milwaukie road;

Ordered that said report be filed.

In the matter of appointment of Irving Clarke and George Avery as Special deputy sheriffs;

Ordered that same be and is hereby approved.

In the matter of the petition of W. H. Wettlaufer and others for a county road;

Ordered that viewers meet at place of beginning of said road on the day of January, 1907.

In the matter of petition of J. M. Allison for liquor license at Boring;

Ordered that a license to sell liquors at Boring be granted said J. M. Allison for a period of six months.

In the matter of the appointment of Board of County Road Viewers for 1907;

Ordered that S. A. D. Hungate, Nixon Blair and Bud Thompson be and are hereby appointed as such board.

In the matter of report of viewers on Gortler road;

Report of viewers read second time and referred to district attorney.

In the matter of the report of viewers on Risley and Oatkin road;

Report read second time and referred to district attorney.

In the matter of change of boundary line between road district 13 and road district 33;

Ordered that the following be taken from road district 13 and added to district 33:

Commencing where the south line of section 12, T. 2 S. R. 3 E. intersects the east line of the Z. C. Norton D. L. C. and running thence north to the N. E. corner of said claim; thence west to the N. W. corner of said claim; thence south to northwesterly line of Allen Mattoon claim; thence northeasterly to the section line between sections 14 and 15; thence south to the northerly line of Ed Miller place; thence northeasterly on north line of said place to the west line of Jacob Gerber place; thence southeasterly following said westerly line to Gerber's place to section line between sections 14 and 25; thence east on section line to Springwater road district; thence south 3-4 miles to center of SW quarter of section 24; thence east one-half mile to line dividing section 24 into east and west halves; thence south to Clear Creek; thence up said stream to its intersection with present boundary of Springwater road district No. 33.
