

SHE DODGES BUTCHER KNIFE

ACCORDING TO COMPLAINT OF PLAINTIFF FILED IN THE CIRCUIT COURT.

Jose B. Hiddleston Wants Divorce From Homer B. Hiddleston on Plea of Gross Cruelty.

Jose D. Hiddleston as plaintiff has had filed through her attorney a complaint for divorce from her husband Homer B. Hiddleston. The two were married in Oregon City on August 29, 1904, and the result of the union is one daughter of the age of one year and 8 months, named Britannia J. Hiddleston.

The plaintiff in her complaint recites that the husband has been in a habit of drinking much and at times when he became intoxicated he proved to be dangerous and cruel, calling her all sorts of names and on several occasions choked her.

Mrs. Hiddleston also states that on September 20, 1906, her husband threw a long butcher knife at her and it was only due to the fact that she dodged that she escaped being struck. In the complaint the plaintiff states that the defendant is unfit to care for the child and begs the court to grant her the care and custody of the child. The husband is a healthy man and when willing to work earns from \$2.50 to \$3.25 per day and that she says she is able to give her \$20 of permanent alimony per month for the support of herself and child.
