By the new system it is not neces sary to ring the bell to get central, merely taking down the receiver making the required connection. The present numbers will be used for a while longer, until the new telephones are installed. When this is done there will not be so many subscribers on one line as heretofore, and the number of rings will not be such a constant worry to the housewife.
