### **WILLAMETTE FALLS POWER FOR SALEM**

TRANSMISSION LINE TO BE BUILT FROM HERE TO CAPITAL CITY.

The Portland Railway, Light & Power company announces that it will construct a transmission line to carry electricity from its Oregon City station to Salem and it will be built this summer. The estimated cost is nearly \$60,000.

The company has a surplus of power since the completion of the Cazadero

Salem and vicinity now depend on electricity manufactured by a steam plant with the exception of some power from a Silverton station where water is available during a part of the year only.

This is a long way to transmit power, as it is nearly 40 miles from Oregon City to Salem by the route the line will follow, but it has been found by the company that power can be carried that distance with a small
