PORTLAND-OREGON CITY RELAY RACE
 The second annual Oregon City-Portland relay race for Portland grade schools will occur Saturday, June 1. The start will be made from the west end of the suspension bridge at 11 a. m., and the finish is at the Y. M. C. A. Fourth and Yamhill streets. The course has been changed in Portland, making the even 13 miles come to the west end of the suspension bridge here.
 A handsome permanent trophy cup will be given by Rodney Hilsan to be held for one year by the winning school and to become the permanent property of the first school winning it three times. A flag will be presented to the winner of each relay.
 The race will be started by Mayor Caulfield, of Oregon City, who will send a message by each team, said messages to be received by Mayor Lane, of Portland.

SUMMER NORMAL OPENS ABOUT JULY 1
 Arrangements are being made by Superintendent Zinser for the opening of the Clackamas county summer normal, which will occur on or about July 1. The Y. M. C. A. building where the term was held last year, has been engaged by Mr. Zinser for the same purpose. The term will last six weeks and will close a few days previous to the semi-annual examinations for state and county certificates which will be held in August. In addition to himself Superintendent Zinser has retained as instructors: Professors L. A. Reed of Parkplace and T. J. Gary of Willamette.
 Superintendent Zinser is also preparing the papers and making arrangements for the annual school meeting which occurs on June 17. At this meeting, all business will be transacted and officers elected for the ensuing year.
P. R. L. & P. COMPANY MAKES BIG LEASE TO W. P. & P. CO.
 A big lease was filed in the office of County Recorder Ramsby Friday, from the Portland Railway, Light & Power company to the Willamette Pulp & Paper company. It provides, in short, for additional water power for the paper company in addition to its present 14,000 horse-power.
 The lease is for 47 years from January 1, 1908, and includes the site of the company's mill A property part of Moore's island, and such rights and privileges as runways, bridges, pipes, etc., necessary for the paper company in the conduct of its factory.
 The lease is for such excess of 14,000 horse-power as may be necessary to produce the full catalogue power of all water wheels now installed by the paper company under all available heads of the Willamette river, and also the full catalogue power of four 42-inch McCormick water wheels and two 36-inch McCormick water wheels, under all available heads, also two 48-inch that may be installed at Mill A, Moore's Island; provided the use of one 36-inch American, one 25-inch Victor Register Gate and one 27 1/2 inch Victor Register Gate wheels be discontinued; and provided this excess power shall not be available when there is a head of less than 30 feet.
 The paper mill is to pay 50 cents per month per horsepower.
 The ground lease covers 40,000 square feet.
