Oregon City does ordain as follows: Section 1. That section 5, of ordi-1897, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Section 5. Every person to whom a

If for the sale, offering for sale, barter or delivery of any spirituous liquors in a saloon, bar-room or in any other place, to be drunk on the premises or in such saloon, bar-room or other place the applicant shall be deemed a retail liquor dealer, and shall pay the sum of Six hundred dollara per annum.

Second. If for the sale, offering for sale, barter or delivery of malt liquors only in a saloon, bar-room or in any other place, to be drunk on the premises, the applicant shall be deemed a retail malt liquor dealer and shall pay the sum of two hundred dollars

Third. If for the sale, offering for sale, barter or delivery of alcohol, spirituous or malt liquors in any place other than a saloon or bar-room, not drunk or to be drunk on the premises, time, the applicant shall be deemed a wholesale liquor dealer, and shall pay
