# DESTROYED

Uprising in Swatow Province, China, Followed by Massacre of Local Authorities

## GUNBOAT DISPATCHED

To the Scene-Report Says That Missionaries Were Saved, but Mission Station Totally Destroyed.

Berlin, May 27 .- Advices just received in this city by cable from Swatow Province, Kwatlug, China, tells a story of rebellion and massacre in that province. It is said that the civil of Grant B. Dimick, County Judge of and military authorities have been Clackamas county, Oregon, and said massacred, that the uprising is quite general, and that pillage and robbery followed in the wake of the uprising.

The German mission station was deserted by its inmates and the station destroyed. It is believed that all those stationed there have escaped and are now safe with friends.

A German gunboat crusing in waters near there has been ordered to the scene. It is said that there are enough marines on board to enable the local authorities to protect foreign interests. Other nations are being appealed to and are expected to send reinforcements.

An uprising in this locality occurred in 1905, at which time five missionaries are said to have been killed.
