Section 5. It shall be unlawful for port or sell any infected or diseased fruit of any kind in the state of Ore-

Section 6. Every person who packs or prepares for shipment to any point without the state, etc., etc., any fruit or fruits, cured or dried, that is infected with insects, pests, or dis-


