Not Crazy, but Fined For Cruelty. Richard Kubisch was before Judge Dimick Wednesday on the charge of insanity. The charge was dismissed in valuation, descriptions or qualities said lot up to Saturday noon October and then he was taken in hand by Recorder Dimick on the charge of cruelty to animals. Mayor Caufield had filed a charge of cruelty, having been a witness of Kubisch's eruelty to his horse, whom he was seen beating on Seventh street hill. He practically admitted the act and was fined \$30 and costs and with a suspension of fine during good behavior. He was told he must pay the costs in the case-\$5 -and having but five cents he proposed leaving his clothes as security.

The horse got loose, and is believed to have killed a colt of plaintiff's val-ued at \$150. The plaintiff brought suit on the grounds that defendant negligently tied the animal in the stall, and placed him in the barn without permission from the plaintiff.

Claim More Pay Due. Adkins Bros. have filed a suit in the Circuit Court against the Greenwood Lumber Company for \$355, alleged to be the balance due for labor and services in logging in the yards of the mill. The plaintiffs allege that the service was rendered between May 5 and September 25, at an agreed price of \$3550, of which \$366 has not been
