FINALLY TO JAIL. After fighting their case for more than ten years in the various courts of the United States and even invoking the Privy Council of England in their fight against extradition, Benjamin Green and John F. Gayner were last week beaten in the Supreme Court of the United States and will have to serve their sentences of four years each in the penitentiary and pay a fine aggregating over \$1,000,000.

Green and Gayner were the famous contractors for the Savannah harbor work, the men who conspired with Captain Oberlin M. Carter, the Army Engineer Corps officer, to do the government out over a million dollars. Carter was the first and only army engineer who has ever gone wrong in money matters, and his downfall was a severe blow to the pride of the corps and almost killed General J. M. Wilson, the then Chief Engineer of the Army. Captain Carter fought his case hard and denied that he had profited by any wrong-doing, but the court took a different view of it and Carter came up like a man, served his term in Leavenworth, and got through with it. He always was a fine engineer, whatever other shortcomings he might have had, and he is now in the employ of a big railroad and his past almost forgotten.

But Green and Gayner were rich men aside from the fruits of their crookedness, and they fought extradition as long as they could in New York, and then jumped to Canada. They lived at the best hotel in Quebec, lived like millionaires there, but they were cut by the only people they would have liked to associate with finally fell out with each other, so that they must have led a very unpleasant existence. Finally they were lodged in jail for seven months and then brought back to the United States. They were convicted in Savannah and now they have the prospect of four years in the penitentiary ahead of them with a fine of over half a million each and having spent \$200,000 each to prevent being convicted. Their sordid romance is all over but the sentence. Justice has caught up with them at last, and probably they think now that Captain Carter was the wiser man.
