Golding, near Milwaukie, as wood sawyer, fell backwards on the saw Wednesday and was seriously cut on the arm and shoulder. Councilman Schofield completed 11 years' service in Vancouver Council Monday night, January 6. As the office pays no salary the record can be considered a very good one.
