NEW GUNS FOR OREGON

Maneuvers to Be Held Next Year at American Lake, Near Tacoma, From August 3 to 12, Inclusive.

General W. E. Finzer, adjutant-general of the Oregon National Guard, has returned from Washington, D. C., where he attended a conference of Pacific Coast adjutant-generals with War Department officials on the subject of coast defenses. Other subjects of importance to the Guard were likewise taken up and General Finzer returns with several valuable acquisitions for the Oregon troops. Not the least of these is new rifles, which will be issued immediately, Oregon getting its equipment ahead of all States in the Union.

Organization of new and independent companies for coast artillery work was the agreement reached at the conference. General Finzer was authorized to recruit three full companies, of about 85 men each. The work will be taken up in the course of 60 days. These troops will be designated as coast artillery for service at the fortifications about the mouth of the Columbia River. They will be trained exclusively in artillery work and in event of war will be stationed in coast forts rather than in the field.

Under the legislation now pending, the National Guard is no longer a State organization. The troops can be called out for any service. It is not a matter of preference on the part of members about taking the field. Every militiaman would have to go with his regiment or be court-martialed and imprisoned. The bill makes "peace soldiers" a thing of the past and soldiers who do not mean business will have no place in the Guard after the passage of the measure referred to.

The new Springfield rifles will be issued this spring. General Finzer managed to get Oregon designated as the very first State to secure these desirable new rifles, with which the regular army is already equipped. Fifteen hundred rifles will be shipped to Oregon for distribution. The first shipment of 100 is due to arrive in a few days and will be utilized by expert riflemen, who expect to qualify for the team that will go East for the National tournament this year.

The old Krag rifles will be returned to the Government. It is understood these arms will be issued to school-boy rifle clubs by the authorities at Washington. While an excellent rifle, they are inferior in many respects to the new Springfield, which is rated as the best military rifle in use by any army. The carrying power of the new Springfield is greater and a new 1500-yard range will doubtless be added to the target ranges of the country. The question of this year's encampment was definitely settled. Instead of coast defense maneuvers, the Oregon infantry and field artillery will have maneuvers at American Lake, near Tacoma, Wash. These maneuvers will be held from August 3 to 12, inclusive.

General Finzer reports a tendency in official circles to regard the National Guard as a more valuable factor in National defense than ever before. The Guard is no longer looked upon as a part of the second line of defense, but of the first line. It is admitted by officials that should hostilities break out, the regular army would be absorbed in the organization of volunteers and the National Guard alone could be depended on as the first line of defense.

SANDY AFTER A PLACE.

J. H. Wewer is Prominently Mentioned for County Commissioner.

J. H. Wewer, of Sandy, has shied his castor in the political ring and will be candidate for County Commissioner, and will seek the place in the primaries. Mr. Wewer is warmly supported by Pat Harris, of Parkplace, and many other Republicans, who argue that the Eastern part of the county should have representation on the board.

It is stated that T. B. Killen, who is serving his second term, will not seek re-election, but that Enos Cahill, of New Era, who was County Treasurer four years, will be an aspirant for the position. With two such sterling citizens as Wewer and Cahill in the race, the contest should be interesting.
