VAN DUSEN IS OUT.

New Fish Warden Will Move Office to Portland. The new warden, H. C. McAllister, will take his office May 1. His first official act will be to move the office from Astoria. He will establish his office in Portland, thus moving the seat of authority from Astoria where the outgoing Fish Warden has made his headquarters during his seven-year term. This change will mark a defeat of lower-river fisheries and a triumph of upper river fisheries. The two fish factions have been warring many years, and the location of the Warden's office has been a subject of bitterness between them.

The fight to oust Van Dusen has been long and strenuous. Van Dusen will quit the state's service leaving the industry in worse plight than when he went in. His enemies say he is wholly to blame. This is exaggeration, however. The real cause of the industry's serious plight is the war between the fisheries, resulting in a deadlock as to really protective legislation.

Upper-river salmon men are jubilant over Van Dusen's defeat and McAllister's appointment. The office is considered one of the best in the state. Its salary is \$2500 a year, with liberal additional sum for traveling expenses. The Warden has one \$1000 clerk and two \$1000 deputies and each deputy is allowed compensation for traveling expenses.

Rainbow Trout at Clackamas. Superintendent Henry O'Malley of the United States Bureau of Fisheries has returned from an inspection trip of the government operations on Rogue River, and states that the prospects are good for a take of 2,000,000 steel head eggs. Ane hundred thousand Rainbow trout eggs have been received from the Station at Baird, California, and will be hatched and liberated from Clackamas station.

PAY TAXES BEFORE APRIL 1; REGISTER BY 5 P. M., APRIL 7.

Taxes become delinquent April 1. Payments made before March 15 are subject to a discount of 2 per cent. By paying half the tax before April 1 an extension to October 1 is secured in which to pay the remaining half. Taxes not paid before April 1 become subject after that date to a penalty of 10 per cent per month for each month they are unpaid. Taxes may be paid by mail. Send check, draft or money order. Statements of taxes due may be secured by mail. Send a letter to the tax department describing the property. The statement will be sent by mail. In paying taxes by mail before March 15 do not forget to deduct the 3 per cent discount. The registration books are open from 8 to 5 o'clock every day at the courthouse. The books will close for the primaries at 5 o'clock, April 7. A citizen, in order to register, must have lived in the state six months. Every voter must register anew this year. The primary elections will be held April 17.

MARKETS ARE QUIET.

Poultry Makes Slight Advance and Eggs Remain Firm. A general quiet pervades the local market this week, and little or no changes can be noticed. Eggs are still selling at fifteen cents a dozen, and the supply and demand are about equal. Cabbage has increased a quarter of a cent in price, and other vegetables have experienced a slight rise in price. Poultry has also made a slight advance over last week. The price of hard wheat flour has dropped from \$4.80 to \$4.65 the barrel.
