DON'T BLOCK THE WHEELS. Much comment, mainly unfavorable is heard over the action of the Crown Columbia Pulp & Paper Company in seeking to obstruct the work of construction by the Hawley Pulp & Paper Company in this city. The temporary injunction will hardly be made permanent, and were there no legal prob-lems involved its dissolution would be speedy, for there is nothing in years that promises so much for the benefit of Oregon City as the coming of the Hawley mill. The concern will not only provide employment for several handred men, and will bring at least 50 families into Oregon City, but it will pay a city tax that will be no trifle, and should be carefully considered in view of the distressing financial con-

dition of the city. Mr. Hawley is essentially a man of foresight and business sagacity and it is not to be assumed that he has gone blindly to work without knowing his legal rights and preparing to see that they are protected to the letter. He is spending hundreds of thousands of dollars in Oregon City and will spend millions among the laboring people in years to come, and this money will find its way into the channels of bus-
