from and after twelve o'clock M., July 1st, 1908, there shall be no malt, spirituous and vinous liquors sold or given away in the precincts of Beaver Creek, Bull Run, Boring, Canby, Canemah, Damascus, Eagle Creek, Estacada, Highland, Molalla, Marquam, Maple Lane, Milk Creek, Oregon City No. 3, Springwater, and Viola, and that after said date the law prohibiting the sale or giving away of such liquors shall be in full force and effect.

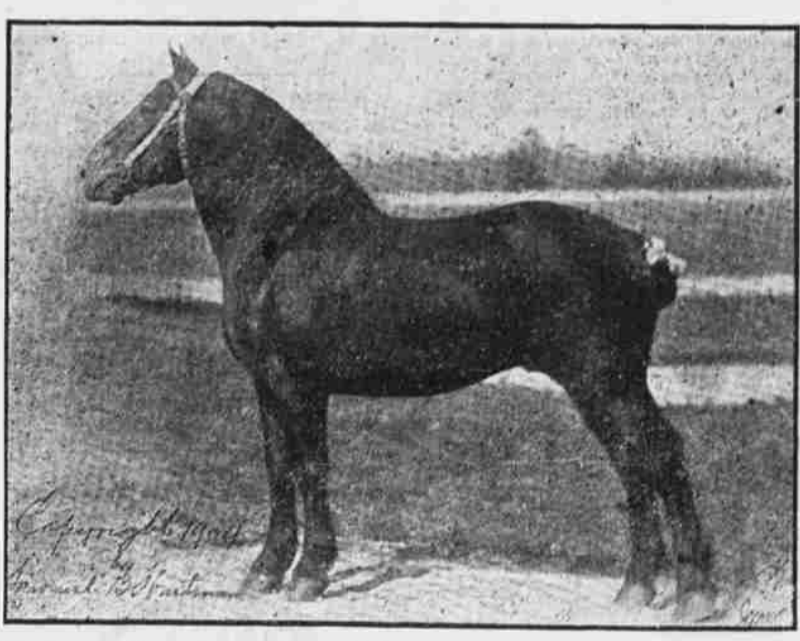
