Cut cold moided oatmeal in slices or fingers, dip in a mixture composed of equal parts of mixed mustard, melted but ter and thick, sweet cream. Roll the pieces on fine dry crumbs, then in beaten egg, again in crumbs and fry crisply brown in hot lard. Serve with broiled

One-half cup butter, one cup sugar, two eggs, one tablespoon molasses, one-half cup coffee infusion, one and three-fourths cups flour, two and one-half ten-spoons baking powder, one and one-half spoons baking powder, one and one-half level teaspoons cinnamon, one-fourth level teaspoon each of cloves, mace and allapice, one-half cup raisins, one-third cup currants, one-fourth cup citron cut in thin strips, one teaspoon vanilia. Cream the butter, add gradually the sugar then the eggs, well beaten and the molasses. Sift together the flour, baking powder and spices, and add alternately with the coffee; then add the vanilla. Beat well and fold in the fruit sprinkled with flower. Bake in a deep cake pan in a moderate oven for one hour.
