DISTRICT BOUNDARY BOARD ACTS OF PETITIONS OF PATRONS IN MANY SECTIONS.

LIMITS ARE ALTERED

Board Declines to Grant Petition to Divide the Colton District For Fear Two Week Schools Would Result.

People who are interested in school government in various sections of Clackamas County thronged the county court room Tuesday in attendance at a meeting of the district boundary board, consisting of Judge Dimick, School Superintendent Gary and Commissioners Lewellen and Mattoon.

The board disallowed a petition to divide District No. 72 at Colton. While the territory of this district is extensive, the number of children of school age is not sufficient to justify a division that would result in two week schools.

The boundary board denied the petition of Walter Gruel and others to detach land from No. 116 and attach it to the Evergreen district, and also denied the petition of Gus and Catherine Lesh and others to detach land from District No. 116 and attach it to the Upper Logan district.

The petition of William Heerd and others, of New Era, to detach a part of the property in the Brown's district and attach it to Leland, was denied. While the boundary board recognized that the petitioners had some justice to their claims, it was considered advisable to let the matter rest until next Spring.
