SALMON EGGS PLENTIFUL.

Bureau of Fisheries Meeting With Success in Propagation Work. The United States Bureau of Fish ries is having unusual good fortune in its work of propagation in Oregon and Washington waters. At Cinckamas Station 69,000 eggs have been taken in two nights and at Cazalero Station all records have been probewith an egg take of 5,443,000 since August 7. Good reports are coming in from the station at Little White Salmon and Big White Salmon on the Columbia River. Eggs are being tak-en at Bonneville for the stations at

Tauner Creek and Eagle Creek.
From Clackamaa Station there is being distributed several hundred thousand black spotted trout. 
