BAD WATER IN SPRING

COLON BACILLI FOUND AFTER EXAMINATION BY STATE BACTERIOLOGIST.

HEALTH OFFICER ACTS

Many Typhoid Fever Cases Traced Directly to Spring on Weinhard Property—City Water Free From Impurities.

The presence of colon bacilli has been shown in the water from the spring in the rear of the Weinhard building, through an examination of the water made by Dr. Ralph C. Matson, bacteriologist to the State Board of Health. This test was made at the request of Dr. J. W. Norris, county health officer, who sent a sample to Dr. Robert C. Yennet, state health officer.
About two weeks ago not less than eight cases of typhoid fever were traced directly to this spring, and following publication of an article about the condition of the water, Dr. Norris ordered the spring closed pending a test, which shows conclusively that the water is contaminated and unfit for use. Dr. Norris also took occasion to have a test made of the city water that is provided by the municipality, and as expected, this water is free from contamination of any sort. Dr. Matson's report to the State Board of Health follows:

To the State Board of Health, Portland, Oregon.
Gentlemen:

I have to report examination of two (2) specimens of water received from Dr. J. W. Norris, or Oregon City, with results as follows:
No. 1, from spring at Oregon City, upon examination shows presence of colon bacilli, and is therefore to be condemned as unfit for drinking or domestic purposes.
No. 2, filtered water from hydrant at Oregon City, upon examination shows no contamination.

VACATION OF OSWEGO STREETS IS WANTED

PLANS OF OREGON IRON & STEEL COMPANY OPPOSED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS.

The County Court met Wednesday and wrestled all day with the problem of vacating streets and alley in Oswego. The Oregon Iron & Steel Company has filed a petition for the vacation of all streets and alleys west of Thirteenth street and Attorney Hunt, of Portland, pleaded with the Court to grant the prayer of his clients, but Judge Gordon E. Hayes argued against the petition, on behalf of many of the Oswego people. Some years ago it was thought that Oswego was to become a second Pittsburg and the property owners laid out the town in lots and blocks. Later the people attempted to incorporate the town, but their petition was faulty, and upon another effort to incorporate, the Oregon Iron & Steel Company filed its vacation petition, although the company made the original dedication. Judge Dimick and Commissioners Lewellen and Mattoon will go to Oswego today and take a look at the situation.
