HOUSEHOLD

Feather Cake, Cream together a tablespoonful of butter and a cup of sugar, add one heaten egg, a cup of sweet milk and two cups of flour sifted with a tea-appoonful of cream of tartat. Put a half teaspoonful of soda in the milk before adding this.

Calves' Brains. Wash the brains carefully and cut each pair into four pieces, taking away all bits of fibre and skin. Rinse well, wipe dry and dip each plece first in beaten egg, then in cracker crumbs, then in egg and again in cracker crumbs and fry in hot fat.

Corn Nuts. To one quart of white corn meal add two tablespoonfuls of baking powder and a teaspoonful of salt and sift well. All milk to form a stiff dough

and remove and serve.

Sliced Baked Apples.

Core, but do not pare, and cut in thin slices. Put a layer in the baking dish and aprinkle with sugar, then another layer of apples, etc., and have last a layer of sugar. Cover the pan and bake ten minutes. Then remove the cover and bake ten minuts longer. Serve with meat as a compote,

Into one pint of sour cream stir one teaspoonful of soda which has been dissolved in two teaspoonfuls of warm water, add the well-beaten white of one egg and one-half teaspoonful of sait. Baked Eggs with Cheese.

Line a shallow dish with thin silees of Swiss (Guyrere) cheeses, Mix care fully together one tenspoonful of made mustard to a dash of cayenne, onethird teaspoonful of salt and twoover the cheese, break in five eggs, pour in the remainder of the liquid and bake in a hot oven until the eggs

Raspberries in Winter,

Red raspberries were a novelty of-fered for sale in Chicago the other A fruit dealer last August put three crates of the berries in cold storage and had them frozen solid. Lately they were thawed out and of-fered for sale at 25 cents a quart. It is said that, though the red raspberries could be kept fresh in a frozen state for three years, the black raspberry treated in the same way last August, has come out of the ordeal entirely lifeless and tasting like cork.

To one quart of beef or mutton broth in double boiler add one-half carrot, stalk of celery and a piece of pepper which has been sauted in but-ter or olive oil. Stir in one-quarter cup of fine taploca and cook one-half hour, or until taploca is transparent. Add one and one-half cups tomato puree and salt and pepper as needed. To Make Cloth Waterproof.

Take eight ounces of sugar of lead, 8 ounces of powdered alum and 21/2 gallons of lukewarm water. Mix in a tub and let stand for twenty-four bours. Sair thoroughly when first mixed and occasionally for the first hour to dissolve the ingredients. Take the garment, (overcost, suit or dress, any thing of woolen or cotton material), brush theroughly, and let soak for twenty-four hours. Take out, let drip until almost dry (don't wring), hang hunting trips and in a driving rain, and come home dry. It does not destroy or interfere with the ventilation or injure the fabric in the slightest degree. The quantities as given here cost about 20 cents and will successfully waterproof an overcoat and suit, or in proportion.

Peter Pans.

One-half cup equal parts of butter and lard, one-half cup of dark brown sugar, one egg, well beaten, one-half cup molasses, two-thirds cup of slightly soured milk, one teaspoon of powdered cinnamon, one teaspoonful of vanilla extract. In two cups of sifted flour thoroughly blend one teaspoonful of soda, one-half cup each of finely chopped raisins and nuts. Cream but-ter and lard with sugar; add the in-gredients in the order given; beating all very thoroughly; bake in well-buttered small patty tins or drop on well-buttered ins and bake in oven.
