Jefferson is also on the line of the Oregon Electric survey from Salem to Albany, and has a large passenger traffic to tempt the interurban to come close enough to capture it.

The industries now consist of one plant, city water plant and creamery, besides opera house, 4 halls, 12 business houses and 2 hotels.
