Seattle came near to having a race riot on her hands last week, following a brutal crime committed by a negro soldier of the 25th infantry, stationed at Fort Lawton.

Livestock shipments to Portland markets for the month of May are far ahead of the same statistics for May of last year, showing the growing importance of this market.

The strawberry crop in the Pacific Northwest this season will break all records, declare the big commission dealers of this city, who expect the Eastern shipments total over 40 carloads from King County alone.

The Northwest is beginning to feel the influence of its new railroads, if not in cut rates, at least in competition for the finest equipment, most convenient schedules and comfortable service.
