SECOND OIL WELL TO BE DRILLED IN

GAS AND OIL FOUND AT STONE SATISFIES OWNERS THEY HAVE THE RIGHT SPOT.

DRILL TO BE SENT DOWN 1200 FEET

Loosened Dirt and Stone Wedges in So That Casing Cannot Be Driven Down Any Further.

WILL PUSH DRILL FURTHER DOWN

BATTERED PIECE OF CASING HAS BEEN REMOVED—OBSTACLES NOW OUT OF THE WAY.

SIGNS OF OIL MORE ABUNDANT DAILY

Will Not Start New Well But Sink Old One Down to 1200-foot Depth, Using Two Shifts.

STONE, Or., March 3.—(Sp1)—There is more or less trouble at the oil well here. It seems that the men who were in charge for a time finally got a piece of casing fast in the bottom of the well and in an effort to fish it out succeeded in battering it so that it is now impossible to get a hold on it and pull it out of the well.

STONE, Or., March 5.—(Sp1)—Well, the announcement is made officially that the oil well people have succeeded in getting the casing that was fast in the well loose and have drawn it out. Thus solving that part of the difficulty confronting the team.

The members of the company are still very enthusiastic and say that the oil and gas so secured shows conclusively that there are both gas and oil in this location and the only question is as to whether or not it is there in paying quantities.

This means that the company, now that the well has been cleared out and will not start a new hole but will push this one down deeper into the earth with the hope that it may prove productive.

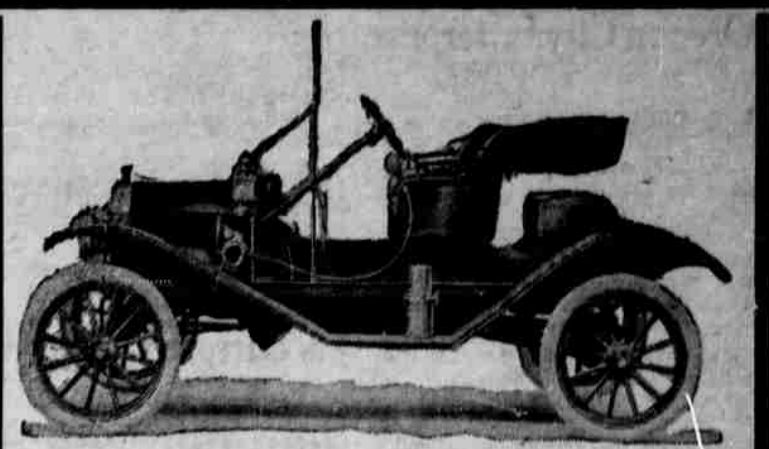
Mr. and Mrs. John Butson are planning for a trip to Europe this summer, and expect to start in the early summer for Mrs. Butson's old home in England.
