In the hog division the market advanced 25 cents. There were very few local hogs, the majority of the receipts having been made up of Eastern shipping.

Subject of interest to the shippers from Idaho and Montana is a special stock train on the Oregon Short Line, leaving Pocatello Sundays and Thursdays to connect with the O. W. R. & N., special livestock trains from Huntington, which will enable shippers from Montana and Idaho points to put their livestock on the market on definite days.

There has been a further improvement in the foreign price and this may force buying locally after a while. At a meeting of the Portland buttermilk board it was decided by creamery men to advance the price of the creamery product to 25 1/2 cents for prints, or two cents a pound above previous quotations. Whether prices in this county will be affected is a question.

The advance in butter is due to the shortened supply now coming forward. The dry weather has curtailed the pasture to a considerable extent, and no increase in the milk may be expected until after the fall rains set in. This year's demand for butter from Alaska is much less than normal, and for that reason prices have not shown the quick response to the shortened supply that they usually do.

Prices at Seattle are slightly lower than in Portland, indicating that the Portland trade is making an effort to force the northern market to a higher point. The advance was forced by makers, who likewise have connections in the north.
