Wolfgang and others to vacate a franchise at Millwaukee Park. Ordered that said petition be granted and said franchise is hereby revoked.

POTATO SHIPMENTS ARE AT STANDSTILL. Potato shipments are at a standstill in this territory. No orders are coming forth from any section and buying for home consumption is extremely limited.

California is at present entirely out of the local market; even the demand for seed being at low ebb. Table stock cannot be sold there at as good prices as are ruling locally at present. Texas has practically withdrawn from the local buying field after a few purchases at Willamette Valley points.
