Though I am now a general superio tendent of a railroad. I was once a locomotive engineer. I crawled up to my present post through every intermediate position. I was young then, and young persons require more sleep than older ones. For awhile the danger of running into obstructions was so terrible to me that I had no thought of sleep. but we had some seventy miles to go before morning, and with the load, the condition of the road, the grades and the locomotive of that date we could not do more than twenty miles an hour, and the required stops lessened that figure.

We had got over seven-eighths of the distance when the monotonous puff of the engine began to tell on me and I looked around for Bob. He was not in the tender. Looking over the tener.
