WOOL GROWERS WAIT FOR BETTER PRICES

In an effort to discredit the regularly established wool sales of the Oregon association some eastern interests are spreading false reports of the time of holding the sales while others assert that no sales will be held at certain points.

This has been officially denied by H. C. Rooper, secretary of the Antelope Wool Growers' association so far as the date at Shaniko is concerned. The date for the sale at that point has been twisted several times by dealers, but so far as the association is concerned, it will be held as announced previously, on June 15.

Practically no wool has been sold in the interior of Oregon or Idaho, notwithstanding the reports being circulated in some quarters. Such reports are said by association people to be circulated by enemies of the present system of selling for the sole purpose of causing holders to let go before regular sales dates and make the latter event a farce.

The small deals that have been closed in eastern Oregon and Idaho but little consideration when the total amount of the shearing there is concerned.

In the Willamette valley the market, while more active, is still on a limited basis. Growers are seemingly awaiting a substantial opening of the market before offering more freely.
