

WHEAT MARKET SLOW WITH OFFERINGS LIGHT

The wheat market in Clackamas county remains inactive with the demand restricted and farmers not pressing offerings. The tone of values holds steady and the prices current at the close of last week were repeated.

RAIN HALTS DIGGING OF POTATOES HERE

The rain will delay the farmers in digging their potatoes. In many of the sections of Clackamas county there is a scarcity of men to dig the potatoes as well as pick apples. Women are assisting several farmers in gathering their crops.

Some of the late clover and buck wheat, which are being threshed, had not filled out as that gathered early in the season. In some places where it is damp the threshers are experiencing much difficulty in getting the clover hulled, as the days have been damp and are short.

The hop market has quieted down somewhat, but buyers are still in the field. The growers are firm, and are making no concessions as yet. Mr. Johnson, of Marquam, has sold his crop of hops for 20 1/2 cents a pound. There are a few others in the county that are disposing of their hops. Many of the farmers are holding their wheat and oats.

WIND DOES BIG DAMAGE TO FRUIT

In the hop market the week's developments are in the main been favorable to the growers, the best grade of the Oregon product being sold at 20 cents, about a cent above the quotations of a week ago, and at the figures given the market shows a fair degree of strength. The inferior lot grades are quoted in a normal way at 14 to 16 cents.

HOP GROWERS ARE FINDING GOOD DEMAND

Several of the hop growers of the state are disposing of their crops and among those who have sold during the past few days are Krays & Siebert, 16 bales at 14 cents a pound; Coyte, of St. Paul, Or., twenty-three bales at seventeen cents; S. J. McDonald, Joe Hiller and J. L. Cook, at St. Paul, at fourteen and fifteen cents. Mishler & Grubb, H. L. Bents bought seventy-three bales of hops from B. J. Grimm. He also bought twelve bales from J. H. Sanquinetto, of Hubbard; seventy-nine bales from George Oglesby, of Aurora, this crop being about the best that has been sold. Aurora is a hop country and many of the best hops that are grown in the state are from that section.

CATTLE MARKET HAS INCREASED STRENGTH

The Portland Union Stock Yards Company reports as follows: Receipts for the week were 1262, 56 calves calves, 3533 hogs, 5580 sheep and 25 horses.

There was some little difference of opinion among buyers and sellers as to whether or not the cattle market was as high last week as any time during the fall. There was an undeniable stiffening in prices as compared with the week previous and it was generally conceded that the market was full strong and in some particulars higher than last week. A glance at the scales will show steers at \$7 and cows at \$6.50.

The hog market was strong to 15c higher this week. Buyers stated that the advance in price was due to the extreme quality of the offering. There has not been a great deal of quality to the hogs that have been offered this fall. Growers have not taken the trouble to finish their hogs, rushing them into the market in only a fairly fat condition. This has had a tendency to reflect on the prices.
