SWEET CLOVER

Mrs. Minnie Hall, of Califa, Callfornia, writes as follows: "Is sweet clover as good for pasturing cows as alfalfa? How many pounds are usually sown per acre?"

There are many farmers who have good aweet clover pastures, and seem to be getting fair results from this erop for that purpose, but as a general thing, it is considered a noxious weed. Stock will eat sweet clover when they have become accustomed to it, but due to a slight bitterness, it is not usually relished as much as other clovers. We have known of instances where, after the stock had become accustomed to sweet clover, they seemed to eat it readily and do very well on it. In comparison with alfalfa as a feed for live stock, alfalfa is far superior.
