

POTATO MARKET IS STILL AT LOW EBB

The market for potatoes is showing no signs of improvement. California mail advices indicate that the trade there is still over-supplied with spuds and no changes are shown in the price.

A small amount of business in potatoes is still passing with Arizona and Texas, but the volume is considerably smaller than usual at this time of the season.

CATTLE PRICE HAVE UNEXPECTED DECLINE

The Portland Union Stock Yards Company reports as follows: Receipts for the week have been cattle 1072, calves 1, hogs 4222, sheep 2524, horses 16.

Notwithstanding the fact that receipts have been light and comparatively few cattle were offered to the trade, prices have sagged fully twenty-five cents all along the line.

HOP DEALERS SAY MARKET IS BETTER

Hop traders report but little business passing and that for the most part between dealers, and the markets of the Coast country generally are said to have eased off to some extent within the past week or two.

In California, as in this state, the recent demand of a few weeks back appears to have been measurably satisfied. That done, the buyers seem to have withdrawn to some extent, at least they are not now disposed to pay the prices offered in January.

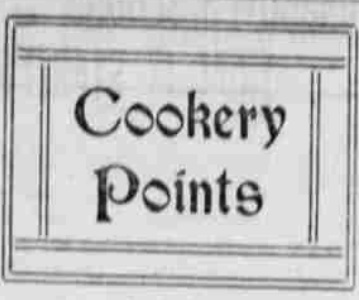
The producers who have a remnant of the 1912 crop still on hand, however, are still inclined for the most part to hold for better figures.

Appie Snow. Core and quarter but do not pare three large tart apples. New tender and rub through a sieve. Beat the whites of three eggs stiff with a cupful of powdered sugar and beat into the apples and continue to beat until like snow.

Vegetable Soup. A good soup is made in the following way: One tablespoonful barley, half a cupful dried onions, half a cupful diced potatoes, half a cupful cut cabbage, half a cupful carrot, half a cupful tomatoes, half a cupful celery cut fine, a tablespoonful salt, a quarter teaspoonful white pepper and a tablespoonful of finely chopped parsley.

Creamed Potatoes. Creamed potatoes may be made from freshly boiled or cold potatoes sliced. For one pint of potatoes make a white sauce, using a tablespoonful of flour, two tablespoonfuls of butter, a cupful of milk, a tablespoonful of chopped parsley, a little cream and salt and pepper to season.

Prune Pudding. Take to one large cup of prunes five apricots or prunellas. Cook tender; remove the pits; return to the pot; add half a cupful of sugar and cook to a pulp. Remove as much of the skin as possible and when quite cool add the beaten whites of two eggs and beat rapidly for ten minutes.

Sauked Codfish. For this breakfast fish remove skin and bones from three slices of fresh codfish and cut each slice in two pieces. Season with a little salt and plenty of pepper and dredge with flour. Dip each piece in beaten egg and then into cracker meal and saute in hot fat.

Halibut a la Creole. Get a thick square piece of halibut or other firm faked fish if preferred. Wash well in cold water, wipe dry and lay in a baking dish well buttered or spread with bacon fat.

Filet of Mackerel. Cut each mackerel into four filets; remove the dark skin. Put them into a basin with pepper and salt, thyme and a bay leaf, three shallots cut into pieces, some sprigs of parsley. Add to these two tablespoonfuls of oil and one of French vinegar and allow them to marinate for three hours.

Meat and Rice Croquettes. To make these croquettes use one cupful of cold boiled rice, one cupful of finely chopped meat of any kind, half a teaspoonful of salt, a saltspoonful of pepper, two tablespoonfuls of butter, half a cupful of milk and an egg. Put the milk on to boil and add the meat, rice and seasoning.
