POTATO PRICES ARE STILL AT LOW EBB

The weakness in the potato trade and the slowness of the demand. coupled with the fact that country interests are overloading the trade is worrying the commission men.

In the Portland trade there has been a fair movement of potatoes but for every sack sold recently. there have been three more recelyed recently. Naturally, this has not had a good effect upon the trade. Receivers are unable to find room for the increased offerings. Their own storerooms are full, the docks are full and the price-is so low that they do not want to take the chance of putting them in public storehouse, with the additional cost.
