Strikes, like wars between nations, cause terrible misery and privation, but labor CANNOT GIVE UP THIS WEAPON. Organized labor, like organized government, can conduct its fights better than unorganized rabbles. There is a general opinion that trade unions are organized for the purpose of conducting strikes for higher wages and

This is not true. Virtually all the legislation tending to IMPROVE THE CONDITION OF THE WORKER has been the result of the concerted efforts of the trade unions.

The present public school system, excepting that in New England, was also the result of the labor movement.
