15,000 MEN

Diplomate Are Backing to Bring About Change Witnout Bloodshed-Huerta's Flight Momentarily Expected

MEXICO CITY, July 14 - At clock tonight the family of President Huerta and other relatives and close friends left the capital for Vera Crus aboard a special train. The train was composed of three sleepers and a bag gage car. Running ahead of it were two military trains carrying 500 men. Following came another military train with 500 troops aboard.

WASHINGTON, July 14.-Although the resignation of General Huerta is confidently expected by the state de-partment and Washington diplomata to be presented at any moment, the constitutionalists, unaffected by the news, are preasing hard their military campaign on Mexico City,
