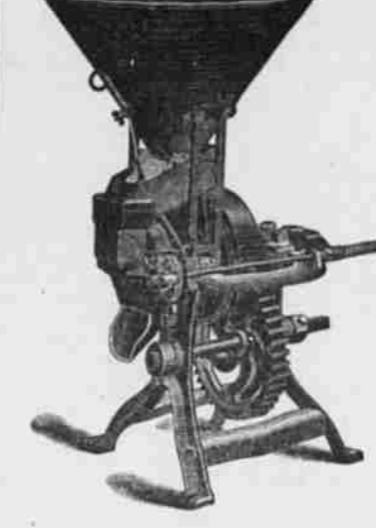

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 28.—With somewhat greater supplies offering from home as well as Idaho and Washington points, there is a slightly easier feeling in the potato trade in this part of the state, although the price change amounts to no more, perhaps, than a nickel a cental.

As yet the local stock is not showing sufficiently good quality to bring extreme values. Idahos are selling at \$1.40 generally, Oregon 1.25 and 1.35, and Washington \$1.25 for best Yakimas.
