PORTLAND EGG TRADE
IS NOT YET SETTLED

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 8.—The egg market is rather unsettled in the valley trade. With some of the local interests freely offering to sell selected candied stock at 34c a dozen, although the general market along the street stands at 35c, together with the fact that some of the other interests are offering as high as 35c dozen f. o. b. country shipping points, there is a seemingly wide spread between the ideas of the trade.

A disinterested view of the situation is that cold storage operators and those handling eastern fresh eggs are forcing the price of local eggs to a higher price than the trade can afford to pay, so as to stop the demand in that quality and force the bulk of the business in the cold storage and eastern stock.

The query has been made how can the sellers of storage and fresh eastern eggs continue to offer higher prices for the Oregon fresh product than they are able to receive for the same. The answer is plain. There are rather limited arrivals of fresh local eggs in the market at this time, and even though receivers were to actually lose 2c a dozen on every sale they made, they would still be making money by the sale of the eastern and cold storage stocks because of the greater profits obtained in the latter by reason of the boosting of local values.

HOP GROWERS WAIT
FOR CHANCE TO SELL

With growers anxiously awaiting a chance to sell their product, the extreme price for hops has dropped to 11c a pound and is really weak at that figure. Prime stock is being freely offered with more sellers than buyers. The market is in a very bad way. One confirmed sale of 500 bales of Pacific coast hops was made in New York recently by a valley interest at 12c a pound for delivery there in December. This means a coast price of 19c a pound for choice goods without considering any profit to the seller. Sales of hops in one day recently are said to reach from 2500 to 3000 bales but several times this amount has been offered to dealers at the prices mentioned. So far as can be ascertained all of the business is domestic, there being no inquiry at all from abroad at this time.

LIVE STOCK RUN IN
PORTLAND LIBERAL

Receipts for the week at the Portland Union Stock Yards Co. have been: Cattle 1766, calves 124, hogs 4407, sheep 6791. The livestock run for the week was very liberal in all lines. The cattle market was steady to a shade weaker. Fat steers sold at \$8.90. Butcher cattle steady. The outlet for swine was very broad. Prices were ten to fifteen cents under last week's quotations. Monday's top were steady at \$7.90. The receipts for the month of September showed an increase of over 5000 compared with September 1913. The run of sheep and lambs this week was also large. Both markets were steady to strong. Prime spring lambs sold in small quantities \$6.00 to \$6.10; fancy yearling wethers firm at \$5.50; choice ewes steady at unchanged prices.

POTATO MARKET DULL
IN ALL VALLEY TOWNS

Potato market is showing a dragging tendency throughout the valley at this time, with practically no buying now reported at country points. Growers are offering more freely, and lower prices have been generally named at Willamette valley points. In Portland as high as \$1.25 a cental is still obtained in a limited way for selected stock, with ordinary down as low as \$1, but the outward movement has been disappointing during recent days. In a measure this is due to the fact that most of the trade stocked up quite heavily during the last few weeks, when there were indications that local offerings would be scarce and unable to fill the requirements of the trade. Until these stocks are worked off there is not likely to be much of a movement in the jobbing trade here.
