Conference With "Mother" Jones Is Promised—Curb on Opinions Is Denied During the Examination

NEW YORK, Jan. 26.—John D. Rockefeller, Jr., today told the United States commission of industrial relations, which is investigating the philanthropic foundations and the cause of industrial unrest...

The bulk of this sum, he said, had been turned over to the Rockefeller Foundation, the University of Chicago, the General Educational Board and the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research.

John D. Rockefeller, his son said, has been making gifts of money since his early boyhood. The witness had no data in his possession which would show "how much more the world would have benefited" if this \$250,000,000 had been given to labor in increased wages.

Mr. Rockefeller announced after the hearing was adjourned today that when he concluded his testimony before the commission he would have a conference with "Mother" Jones...

MEXICO CITY, Jan. 27.—Provisional President Garza and his government left the capital early today for Cuernavaca, where a new seat of government will be established.

The last contingents of the army of evacuation were hurrying through the streets late today. The army of occupation lingers on the outskirts of the city, but is expected to enter soon.

The National Palace, the federal telegraph and postoffice and other government establishments are closed. The incoming Carranza forces are commanded by General Alvarado, ex-post commander here.
